Prosecutors in New York have immense power in the criminal legal system, which means that they have a disastrous impact on our lives especially when they break the rules. In fact, a recent study by the National Registry of Exonerations found that nearly 1/3 of 2,400 exonerations nationally included #ProsecutorialMisconduct.

What's worse is that even when courts identify misconduct, prosecutors are rarely held publicly accountable. New Yorkers deserve better.

#AccountabilityNY - a group of law professors and @CivRightsCorps - have launched a project shining a light on #prosecutor misconduct. The law professors filed grievances against prosecutors who have been identified in public records doing improper things, including hiding evidence, highlighting false

testimony, tainting grand juries, and more.
